MADEM REELS GROUP has established, documented, implemented, and maintains the PEFC Chain of Custody system, in line with the requirements of PEFC ST 2002:2020 PEFC Chain of Custody of Forest and Tree-Based Products - Requirements.

MADEM REELS GROUP is committed:

- To fully support the responsible forest management practices that both protect the biodiversity and ecosystem integrity.
- To ensure that the sustainable product can be well-identified and managed in the organization.
- To comply with the social, health, and safety requirements defined in Chain of Custody.

MADEM REELS GROUP is not dealing with Forest and tree-based material sources and activities, which are:

- Not complying with applicable local, national, or international legislation on forest management, including but not limited to forest management practices; nature and environmental protection; protected and endangered species; property, tenure, and land-use rights for indigenous peoples, local communities or other affected stakeholders; health, labor, and safety issues; anti-corruption and the payment of applicable royalties and taxes.
- Activities where the capability of forests to produce a range of wood and non-wood forest products and services on a sustainable basis is not maintained, or harvesting levels exceed a rate that can be sustained in the long term.
- Activities where forest management does not contribute to the maintenance, conservation, or enhancement of biodiversity on the landscape, ecosystem, species, or genetic levels.
- Activities where ecologically important forest areas are not identified, protected, conserved, or set aside.
- Activities where forest conversions occur, in other than justified circumstances, where the conversion.
- Activities where the spirit of the ILO Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work (1998) is not met.
- Activities where the spirit of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (2007) is not met.
- Conflict timber.
- Genetically modified trees.
